<u>I Owe You An Apology</u>

"Call no Man Father:" What the Church Really Says About the Priesthood

While all of our priests are on their convocation retreat, I've spent some extra time this week praying for them (especially Fr. Steve) and reflecting on the gift that they are to us. Here are some thoughts that came out of that reflection.

You may have heard protestant friends take issue with the fact that our parish priests are commonly given the title, "Father." They cite the Gospel of Matthew, Chapter 23, where Jesus specifically says to "Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven." Interestingly, they never seem to take issue with the practice of calling someone *teacher* (from the previous verse) or of using the more general term *leader* (from the following verse) both of which are also prohibited, yet commonly used terms in protestant churches as in all of society. They also fail to mention that in numerous New Testament letters and other writings, the Apostles and early church leaders very often refer to themselves as fathers, leaders and teachers.

This is a really good example of the danger of taking individual phrases or verses from the Bible out of context. This practice is dangerous, because in the tens of thousands of verses of the (roughly) 73 books of the Bible, you can find a way to interpret something, somewhere in the Bible to say almost anything if you interpret it out of context. This is what causes disunity and division in the Church (i.e the thousands of different protestant denominations, who each insist their own interpretations on the correct ones.) Thank God for the Catholic Church's magisterium, which applies its 2000 continuous years of wisdom, led by the Holy Spirit, to keep us unified in considerations involving faith and morals. But back to the term, "father."

When considered in context, that verse is part of a larger condemnation of Jesus about leaders who forget this crucial truth - Leadership is service. It should never be self serving, and always self giving. Leadership is a gift that the leader gives to those being led, or more accurately, leadership is a gift that GOD is giving to those being led. What a great lesson, and far more valuable than just a prohibition of using a certain title.

So what?! What does that lesson mean to all of us who are not leaders, teachers or "fathers?" It means that we, as receivers of the gift, need to recognize it as a gift and respect it and be grateful for it. That can be pretty easy when the gift takes the form of affirmation or pleases us in general. But we also need to see the value of the God's gift when it takes the form of confrontation, exhortation and leadership decisions that are disagreeable to us. Authority, especially Church authority, is a gift from God. It's what unifies us.

In part 2 (next week) I will defend this position with some very specific writings of the Church, from the early Church to Vatican II.
