In July 2024, I offered a 6-month recap of the Signs & Symbols I've spoken of during our Masses on the first weekend of the month. I'm once again offering a quick summary of my signs

and symbols from August to January. I may also from time to time describe them during the first full week of weekday Masses.

Hands – The posture of our hands is like the expression of our soul. Hands embrace, lift up, defend, and praise. During worship, we recognize the priest's prayer posture of surrender, and the power of the sign of peace. We move our hands to make the sign of the cross and hold them together near our chest. May the proper use of our hands during Mass remind us of the proper use of hand gestures.

Candles – In ancient times, candles were a necessity for worship, let alone guidance through the dark. Despite having electricity, our lit candles during Mass symbolize Jesus the Light of the World. Self-consumed in light and warmth, the candle stands ready to face the darkness. May lit candles represent our souls ready to serve and to give light.

Procession of bread, wine, and tithes – “Pray brethren that my sacrifice and yours...” These words are spoken by the priest after the gifts of bread and wine have been prepared on the altar. The laity offer their sacrifice of praise with the priest as the presider. The people offer their gifts in procession (including their financial tithes) to collaborate as God's family to contribute to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Music – As Jesus and His disciples sang Psalms of praise after the Last Supper, so we too lift up our voices to the Lord during the Liturgy, whether in the pews or in the choir. From early Gregorian chant to today's traditional or contemporary hymns, we pray twice when we sing. Neither performance nor distraction, sacred music supplements the action taking place at the altar. Our hearts are revealed in our hymns at Mass.

Presider's chair – From “ex cathedra”, the chair represents the teaching office, dating back to the first pope St Peter. The word cathedral derives from this term. The chair is a sign of a divine appointment, and is different from the deacon and servers' chairs by its size. It is commonly designed with arm rests.

Ciborium and Chalices – These sacred vessels are made of precious metals. They have a singular use for distributing the Bread of Life and the Precious Blood. In general terms, they are bowls and cups, but the Church in her wisdom elevates the definition of what is set apart for the celebration of Mass. The **sacrarium** is the sink that is used to dispose of any remaining precious blood or small particles of the Eucharist. This drain goes directly into the ground.

I hope these sacred signs and symbols remind us that our loving God wants us to “see” spiritual happenings through objects used in worship. More topics to come!

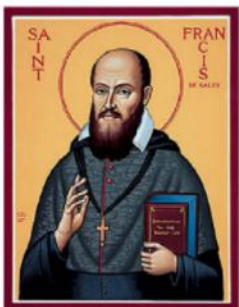

ROOTED IN CHRIST PASTORAL PLANNING PROCESS

As Bishop Walkowiak announced in October, it has been more than a decade since the Diocese of Grand Rapids has undergone a pastoral planning process. We must undertake a process such as this to review critical realities facing our local church both now and in the future, along with discerning how the Lord is calling us to bring others to Christ with new opportunities. Meitler, a Milwaukee-based national Catholic consulting firm, is facilitating the study. Meitler has worked on previous studies for the diocese.

How did this process come about?

The priests of the diocese, through the Presbyteral Council, approached Bishop Walkowiak in 2023 about undertaking a pastoral plan. They believed that a comprehensive data analysis and plan would better inform priest personnel changes along with decisions about current and future potential ministry in West Michigan.

Who is conducting this process and how are parishes being represented?

The Meitler Group is assisting Bishop Walkowiak, along with a diocesan leadership team. Each of the six deaneries has a planning committee made up of two representatives from each parish within the deanery. These representatives were selected by their pastor.

How can you be involved?

First, please pray for the Lord's guidance in this process. We must take time to discern where He is calling us to make hard decisions along with where He is calling us to expand our evangelization efforts.

What is the timeline for this process?

Mid-July 2024:

- Priests met to discuss the planning process and its goals.

Fall 2024:

- Demographic, religious, and parish data were collected for study and analysis.
- Consultants visited parishes and schools across the diocese to tour facilities and match narratives with data trends.
- Pastors appointed deanery planning committee representatives.
- Deanery planning committees began meeting.

Winter 2025:

- Key findings released to parishes

Spring 2025:

- Interim report published for review

Summer 2025:

- Final plan published
