




After the priest's final blessing, Mass always ends with a dismissal. This falls under the category of "The Concluding Rites". There are four options in the English Roman Missal:

A Message of the Cross

Friends,

A friend and parishioner recently shared a very encouraging statistic. The Google search "how to become a Catholic" rose by 373% from April 20–26, the days marking the late Pope Francis's final public appearance and death and setting the stage for the conclave that elected Pope Leo XIV.

That's not only very encouraging, it's also perfect timing, because we're just about to begin our next cycle of OCIA. The Order of Christian Initiation for Adults is far more than just a way for non-Catholics to investigate our faith to consider making it their home. It's also an opportunity for Catholics who have not yet enjoyed the benefit of the sacraments of Reconciliation, Communion or Confirmation.

You might recall just a few weeks back when we celebrated several adult parishioners receiving each of those "sacraments of initiation." Who in your life might benefit from full participation in the Catholic

Church? Now is the time to reach out to those people and to encourage them to call the parish office to register for our OCIA program. Whether

they just need to finish their Sacraments of Initiation by being Confirmed, or they come from a different Christian denomination and want to tap into the life giving benefits of Holy Communion and Reconciliation, or even if they have no prior faith experience at all, but admire what they see in you, that special spark of life and love that comes from the Holy Spirit, there's no better time to reach out to those folks with a warm invitation. You never know whose lives you could change for all eternity.

Not every person who looks into the Catholic faith decides that it's right for them, and not everyone who participates in the OCIA program will follow through to receive the Sacraments. But even then, the opportunity to learn more about our faith can help spouses, children, in-laws and friends better understand and relate how important our faith tradition is to us. Your, yourself may be feeling like you gave up on faith formation too early, leaving big holes in your understanding and living out of the faith. The OCIA program is open to everyone, with no expectations or commitments required of anyone. Please share the word, and help us to reach out to everyone God is calling to Himself through us.


